ammy Lewis believes every business owner needs a mentor. In fact, she has two. Two seasoned business professionals to bounce ideas off of, brainstorm with and offer different perspectives on anything to do with the success of her 9-year-old home care agency.

Not that she lacks the drive and talent to succeed on her own, but Lewis says the insights and guidance of these key advisors have been critical to the success of Ideal Healthcare Services. The Raleigh-based agency provides personal care, companion services and skilled nursing care to elderly and disabled adults in 11 North

Carolina counties. Lewis is looking to open a second location in Greensboro early next year in response to increased demand for services in Guilford County.

"Our mission is to provide all clients with a compatible companion/aide who will enhance their quality of life," Lewis says. Home visits from a physician and a nurse practitioner are also available; Lewis, an RN, is studying to become a nurse practitioner herself to help meet the growing need for such services.

Business Lesson Number One: Delegate

Lewis' relationship with her first mentor, County Commissioner James West, dates back to 2007, when she participated in the City of Raleigh Pacesetters program. "He encouraged me to apply for an SBA loan and helped me hone my business skills," she recalls.

Lewis met Luther Williams, manager of the City of Raleigh's Business Assistance program, approximately four years ago. She

says Williams is always available to answer her questions or discuss anything to do with Ideal Healthcare's business operations – from the business plan to personnel or budgetary matters.
